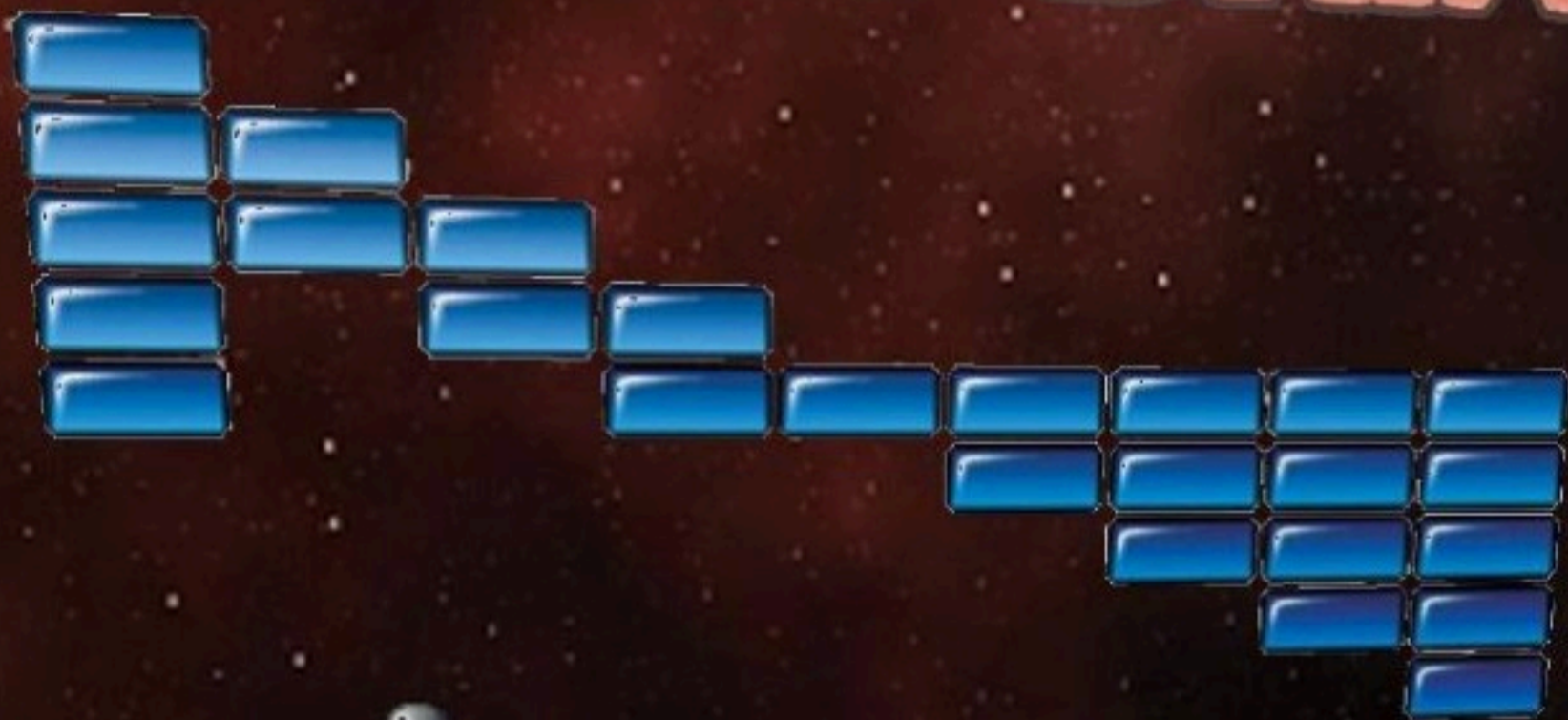

Getting Started

1. Insert the Crazy Brix cartridge into your ATARI® 7800™ ProSystem as explained in your Owner's Manual, and turn on your console.
2. Plug a joystick controller into the left controller jack to use the joystick, or you can also plug your paddle controllers into the right controller jack to use them.
3. Press [Select] or move the controller handle left or right to choose a one or two-player game and select the skill level: Easy, Normal or Hard.
4. Press [Reset] or the left controller button to start the game.
5. Press [Pause] to pause the game; press it again to resume play.
6. Moving the controller handle (or paddle) left or right will cause your Deflector to move in the same direction. Use the fire button to serve the ball.

Playing The Game

Break through 32 levels of Brix that will challenge and frustrate you. You start the game with three Deflectors and lose one each time you allow both balls to escape off the bottom of the screen. Keep both in play for as long as possible to rack up the big points!

You can play the game with either the joystick controller or the paddle controllers. If you are playing with the joystick, make sure it is plugged into the left controller port for one player, and for two players make sure an additional joystick is plugged into the right controller port. You must also ensure that the left difficulty switch is slid to the right. If you are playing with paddle controllers, make sure they are plugged into the *right* controller port. You must also ensure that the left difficulty switch is slid to the left.

Skill Levels

Each Skill Level starts the player at different points in the game (including the player's score):

- On the 'Easy' Skill level, the balls start at their slowest speed. This is ideal for young children or first-time players.
- On the 'Normal' skill level, the balls start at their standard speed. This is good for people already familiar with the game, and similar games of this genre.
- On the 'Hard' skill level, the balls start out at a much faster speed, and hit their max speed much higher. Only players with insane reflexes will be able to handle the fast-pace of this skill level!

Scoring

The number at the top-left of the screen is the current score for player one, and the number at the top-right of the screen is the current score for player two. Point values for Brix can range from 10 points the closer they are to the bottom of the screen all the way up to 150 points toward the top of the screen. As long as both balls are in play, 100 points are also added to each Brix hit.
